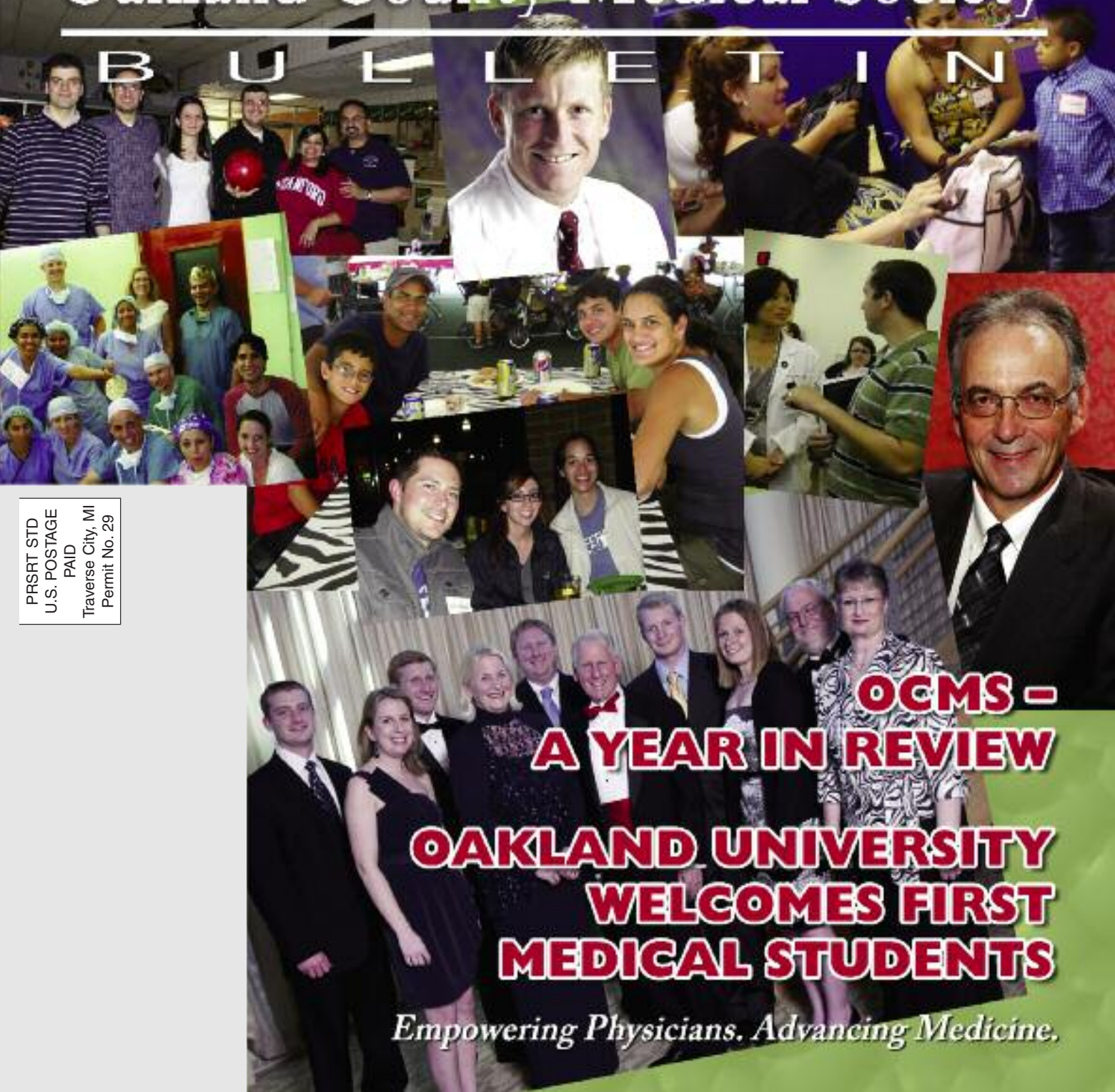

## THE ISSUES FACING OUR PHYSICIANS

On November 30th physicians face a crucial deadline. On this date the congressional super committee is required to present a plan to cut \$1.5 trillion from the budget. In addition, the current Medicare fee schedule is due to expire. Organized medicine has been working diligently for a permanent elimination of the SGR formula which is used to calculate fees to physicians. Our hope is that this can be included in any budgetary revisions. If the super committee fails to act and/or no correction is achieved in the flawed SGR formula, then physicians could face draconian cuts of as much as 30%. This will have a dramatic effect for many practices. Many physicians will have to face the difficult question of whether participation in Medicare is viable, with the very survival of their practice at stake.

In a greater sense, November 30th signals the beginning of a major change in the way medicine is practiced in this country. We are at a crossroads not only financially but for the more important question of whether we will be able to control our patients' care. January of 2012 will see the creation of the first ACOs. This entity is an integral part of the Obama health plan. This abbreviation stands for Accountable Care Organization. Most physicians groups are currently gearing up for transition to an ACO. An ACO is intended to generate incentives for care providers to work together across multiple care settings and to provide financial rewards from the Medicare shared savings program for lowering costs and meeting 65 quality of care metrics. In a recent review article in the *New England Journal of Medicine* it was estimated that many organizations such as these will lose money in the first three years. Physicians can control an ACO but it will require coordination across clinical, administrative and financial lines. Unfortunately, physicians have been

poor at this in the past.

Along with the ACO, the other created entity is the IPAB which stands for Independent Payment Advisory Board. This was what was originally known as the "death panel." At present, however, they are prohibited from rationing care or changing benefits for patients, but they can cut payment rates to doctors. Physicians will be the main target for reductions because hospitals are exempt until 2020 under the law. Their primary method of controlling costs will be payment reductions. The president will nominate 12 of the 15 members of the panel and it is estimated that only 1 or 2 will be physicians. The key point is that at the present time the IPAB is not subject to congressional oversight.

Clearly, certain aspects of the Obama health plan are positive. Eliminating pre-existing clauses and attempting to provide insurance to the uninsured are excellent ideas. Unfortunately, however, the bill essentially is an insurance program and does little to combat the various public health issues that we have in this country.

In summary then, what is the real issue? It is that we are going to lose control of our patients' care. It could be dictated by non-physicians and that could affect patient care. Going forward we need to stress this fact to legislators and the public. The quality of medical care in this country will suffer and without question the finest medical care in the world still exists in the United States.

These issues can only be addressed on our behalf by organized medicine. I would encourage you to contact your legislators. This can be facilitated through the MSMS website. These emails are influential with legislators. We still have time to affect future events and I would urge you to actively participate.



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## CURRENT IMPLICATIONS OF ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE

My last article discussed a recent case of multi-drug resistant tuberculosis in our community and the direct economic costs associated with treating this disease, as well as the devastating financial cost of not containing transmission of MDR-TB, such as experienced in New York City in the late 1980s. While community awareness of some of the threats associated with communicable disease has improved due to greater messaging from public health as well as highly visible emergent diseases such as SARS and the recent novel H1N1 influenza, the parameters for issuing orders because of a health threat to others remain largely esoteric.

Today public health encompasses a wide range of services and programs, but it began as part of national security, to protect the population and support the stability of the government from the threat of epidemic disease. During the summer of 1793, even as the capital was under construction in Washington, DC and the federal government was working out of Philadelphia, an outbreak of yellow fever killed 10 percent of the population of Philadelphia. Government officials fled the city.

The "police power" of protecting the health and safety of the citizens was the primary activity of colonial

governments and this power has been retained by the states under the Tenth Amendment to the Constitution. While the federal government has used national security legislation as a way of gaining some control over public health, the vast majority of authority remains with local and state government. Exceptions to local control are eight specific diseases which are designated quarantinable by a Presidential order. They are: cholera; diphtheria; infectious tuberculosis; plague; smallpox; yellow fever; viral hemorrhagic fevers (e.g. Lassa, Marburg, and Ebola) and SARS. All other infectious disease authority resides with the police power of state and local government.

On a daily basis, Oakland County Health Division provides education, voluntary health services, regulation of environmental health, and enforcement of some business regulations such as restaurant inspection law. Occasionally, however, authorities must be prepared to restrict the actions of individuals or groups which represent a health risk to others from a communicable disease. Isolation and quarantine are two tools that can be used to contain a communicable illness. While often used interchangeably, the two strategies differ in that isolation applies to infectious persons and gives time to provide care and treatment, but quarantine applies to

well persons who have been exposed to an illness when it is not yet known if they have been infected by the contagion.

Although Oakland County has legal authority to implement quarantine, isolation, and treatment, these powers must be implemented fairly and only with great need. Concurrently, the level of force necessary to achieve compliance and who will implement the measures must also be considered. As enforcement restricts the liberty of an individual or a group of individuals, due process rights apply to isolation and quarantine. Both



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substantive due process, which is whether the actual detention is necessary, and procedural due process must be met. Procedural due process includes the right to notice, counsel and hearing. However, although

authority to implement quarantine or isolation is vested in local public health, emphasis on good communication and education almost always alleviates the need to pursue legal action. This was recently put into practice



## Public Health Law Network

### Summary of Authority and Actions under Michigan's Public Health Code Regarding Public Health Emergencies

Michigan's Public Health Code provides an array of actions that state and local health officers can use to respond to a public health emergency. This document is intended to assist health officers and their attorneys by identifying potential actions and linking to the applicable law.

after a measles case was reported in our county. Because the ramifications and potential virulence of measles was clearly communicated, compliance with a brief self-imposed quarantine for some exposed persons was smoothly implemented. Fortunately, there were no secondary cases arising from this one case. In recent years in Oakland County, there have been two rare occasions when isolation orders were needed to ensure that a patient with active tuberculosis complied with public health orders until no longer contagious. In

these instances, this also aided continuity of care for an uninsured or homeless individual.

The authority to protect the public from imminent danger is the critical role for local public health. By retaining the authority at the local level, response can be quick and tailored to Oakland County and its specific needs and population. Michigan's Public Health Code vests this authority in both state and local public health officials under the statutes listed in the tables on these pages.

## OAKLAND UNIVERSITY WILLIAM BEAUMONT SCHOOL OF MEDICINE WELCOMES THEIR FIRST CLASS

On Monday, August 8th, Oakland University William Beaumont School of Medicine welcomed its first class of 50 medical students.

Oakland County Medical Society presented each student with a copy of *Netter's Atlas of Human Anatomy* and OCMS President Sherwin Imlay, MD, gave the opening speech to welcome the students.

More than 3,200 students applied for the 50 positions in the school's first class. Of those admitted, 70 percent are Michigan residents; 46 percent are women; and 15 students from eight other states from the east to the west coast have moved to Michigan to attend the new medical school.

Many were attracted by the school's innovative approach to medical education. Unlike traditional medical schools, the OUWB curriculum combines basic science instruction with clinical training (where students interact with patients) across all four years, with a focus on team-based, participatory learning in small groups. The school's curriculum also highlights promotion and maintenance of health, not just diagnosis and treatment of disease.

"We have created a medical learning community where students are not just students – they are our learning partners," says Robert Folberg, M.D., founding dean of the school. "While our students are learning medicine for the first time, our faculty members will be renewing their knowledge and study of medicine."

## SECRETARY OF STATE CHANGE ADDS THOUSANDS TO DONOR REGISTRY

From April 20, the day after Michigan Secretary of State Ruth Johnson directed the change, through October 19 there were more than 220,000 new names added to the Michigan Organ Donor Registry. That represents an increase of 28 percent over the same period last year, when there were 171,764 signups.

"We are encouraged by these improving numbers, which will save lives," Johnson said. "Those awaiting a transplant can rest assured our office, along with our partners at Gift of Life Michigan and the Michigan Eye-Bank, will continue promoting this cause in every county of our state."

More than 2.3 million residents are on the state's organ donor registry, according to Gift of Life Michigan, but Michigan still ranks 44th nationally in organ donor registrations, so there is more work to be done, Johnson said.

Last year, there were 289 organ donors and 1,067 tissue donors in Michigan. Each organ donor can save up to eight lives. Each tissue donor can improve the lives of up to 50 people.

"We are thrilled by the number of people making this life-saving decision to join the donor registry," said Richard Pietroski, CEO of Gift of Life Michigan, the state's organ and tissue recovery organization. "It's so important to the 3,000 people in Michigan in need of an organ transplant and the many thousands more who need tissue or corneal transplants. Secretary Johnson and her staff are the new front line of the 'transplant team.'"

One of those waiting for a transplant is Jai'Wan Davis-Harbour, 11, from the Metro Detroit area.

"My son, Jai'Wan, desperately needs a kidney to survive and live a normal life without dialysis. What Secretary Johnson has done gives us hope that the phone call we're waiting for will finally come," said the boy's mother, Cherisse Davis-Harbour.

Anyone can join the Michigan Organ Donor Registry at [www.giftoflifemichigan.org](http://www.giftoflifemichigan.org), calling 800-482-4881 or by visiting any Secretary of State branch office. Those who sign up receive a red heart logo sticker to place on their driver's license that indicates their wish to be an organ donor. A new card with a permanent heart emblem is issued at renewal time.

There is no age limit to join the Donor Registry. In fact, the oldest donor in Michigan was 103 years old. There is no medical history that prevents someone from joining the Donor Registry – decisions as to what can be donated are made on a case-by-case basis at the time of donation. People with cancer, HCV, diabetes, hypertension and lupus have successfully donated organs or tissues in the past.
